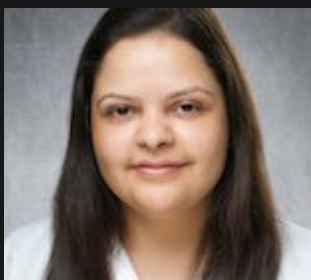
## Dr. Mohamed Aymen Ben Abdessalem
